Cahaba River National Wildlife Refuge

This refuge, located east of West Blocton, Bibb County, protects the largest remaining stand of the rare and showy Cahaba lily and is home to more than 60 endangered or threatened plant and animal species, including the endangered Cahaba shiner, goldline darter, round rocksnail, and cylindrical lioplax snail. Established in 2002 to protect and manage a unique section of the Cahaba River and the land adjacent to it, the refuge currently encompasses more than 3,500 acres and 3.5 miles of river. The refuge is also home to stands of the threatened native longleaf pine, Alabama's official state tree.
